Saleh Adem (UoC) will contribute with a discussion on the intersection between the *kafala* (sponsorship) system and EU migration control externalisation regime in Ethiopia examining how the EU's externalization efforts, including capacity-building initiatives and development projects in Ethiopia, may inadvertently redirect migration flows towards the legal pathways offered by the *kafala* system in GCC countries.
