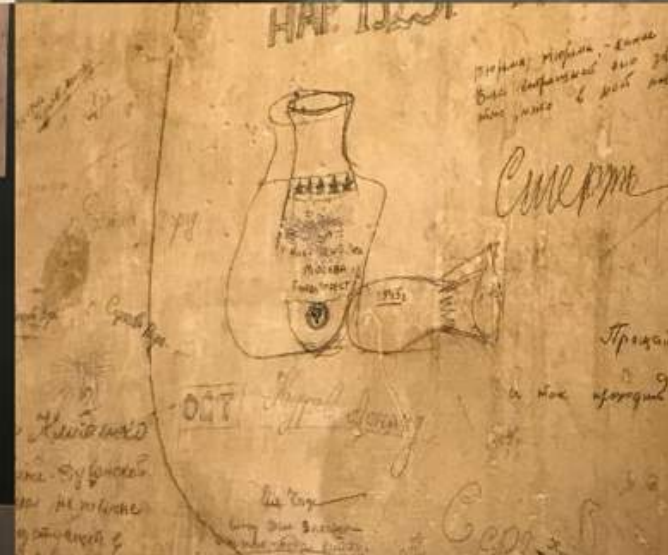
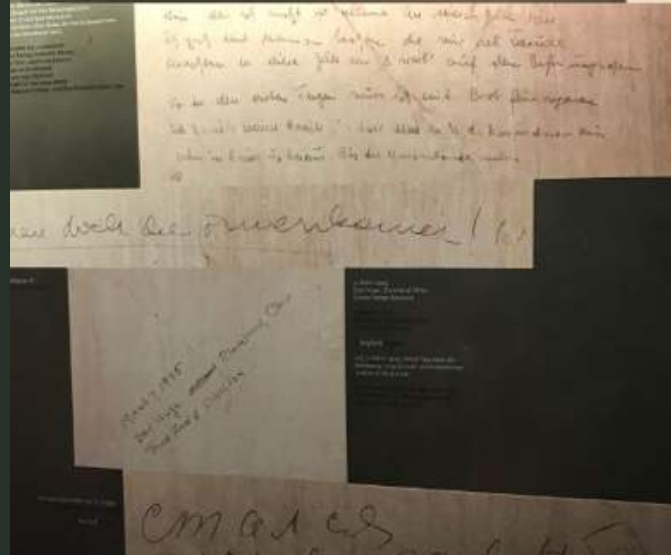
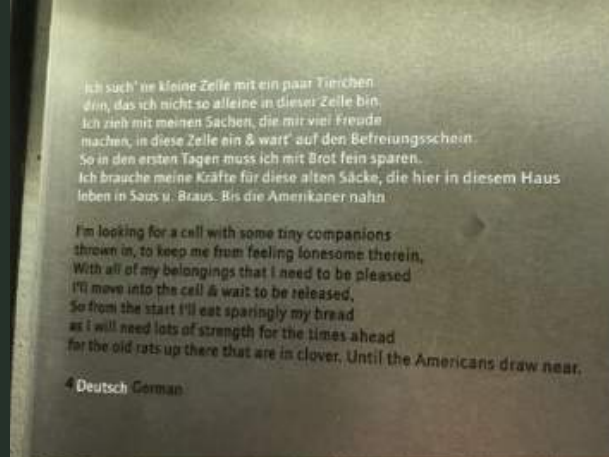
Visiting Cologne`s National Socialism Documentation Centre



Cologne's National Socialism Documentation Center

Cologne's National Socialism Documentation Center is the largest regional memorial site in all of Germany for the victims of the Nazis. It was founded by a resolution passed by the Cologne city council on December 13, 1979. For many years, the center's activities were restricted to research and academics. So on June 11, 1987, the council once again passed a resolution calling for "the foundation of the NS Documentation Center of the city of Cologne," and the center gradually developed into the comprehensive institution it is today.

The former Gestapo prison was inaugurated as a memorial site on December 4, 1981. The exhibition was updated in 2009. In addition, the Gestapo rooms at the back of the prison, as well as their bunker in the sub-basement were opened to the public. Beginning in 2012, the former place of execution in the courtyard will also be a part of the memorial. Some 1,800 inscriptions and drawings done by prisoners have survived on the cell walls.

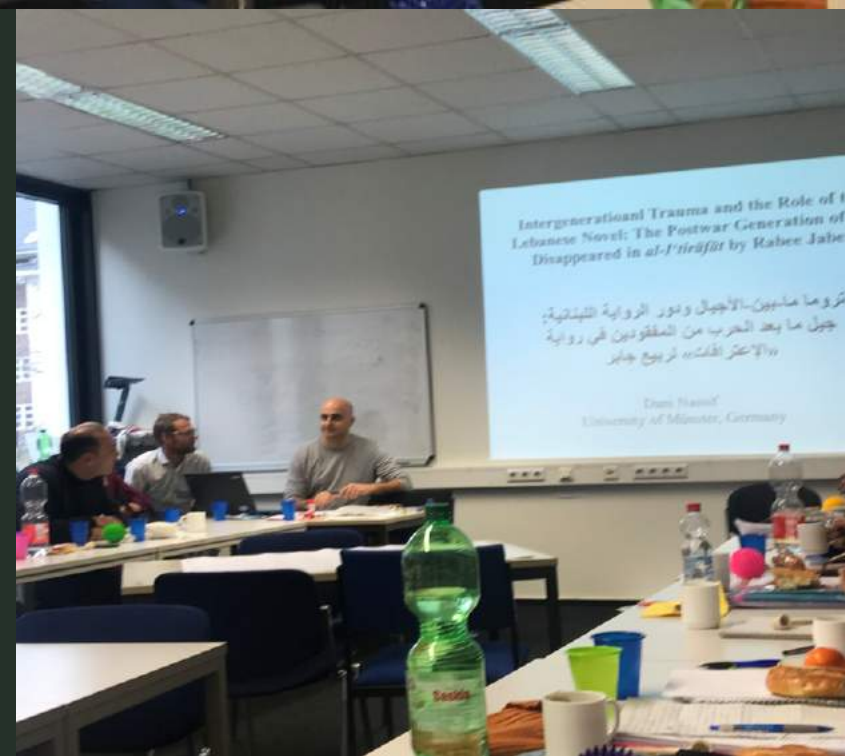
